TPGC Prize and Point System

Several of you have asked how are the Prizes Awarded and how does the Point System work.

There is an Overall Low Net Tournament winner and each flight has a set of winners so prizes can be evenly distributed throughout the group and everyone has a chance to win something no matter what their handicap. So it breaks down like this:

- Overall Low Net – 1 Dozen NXT's or as you may hear us refer to it as "The Yellow Box".
- By Flight - Prizes Awarded for each Flight. We try to limit the number of people in a flight to 8 to 10 people.
 - Low Gross – ½ Dozen Golf Balls.
 - Low Net – ½ Dozen Golf Balls.
 - 2nd Low Net – 1 Sleeve.
- Team – The "Team Game" is always "Two (2) Best Net Balls of Foursome". Each Member of the team with the lowest net score wins 1 Sleeve. Occasionally, if we have a large group, the members of 2 teams with the lowest net scores will be awarded 1 Sleeve.

You can only win one prize, not including any team prize. If you win the Overall Low Net you are removed from your flight's awards. This allows greater distribution of prizes throughout the flight and tournament participants.

Closest to the Pin – Is a "Buy In" event, usually \$1 per Closest to the Pin holes in a tournament, generally 2 or 4 so it would be \$2 or \$4 per person to "Buy In". Each Closest to the Pin hole is divided into 2 flights, generally divided by course Handicap in the middle of the field. So, if on any particular day your Course

Handicap is between 18 and 24, you need to look at the card you are signing to make sure you sign the correct card. It really screws things up if you don't.

Prizes Awarded:

- By Closest to the Pin Flight
 - Closest – Share of the \$\$\$.
 - 2nd Closest – Sleeve of Balls.

Skins – Is another "Buy In" event, usually \$5 or \$6 per person "Buy In". You get ½ of your Course Handicap up to 18 stokes. These stokes, often referred to as "Pops", are applied one at a time to the course handicap holes hardest to easiest rated 1 to 18. To win a skin you must have the lowest net score on the hole without being tied with another golfer.

Prizes Awarded:

- The Monies collected are divided evenly by whole dollars amongst the Skin Winning Participants.

Hole In One Insurance – There is **no "Buy In"** for Hole in One insurance. Note above where I said: **Skin Monies collected are divided evenly by whole dollars amongst the Skin Winning Participants.** What this means is, if there are 5 skins and after dividing the monies by 5 there is a remainder of \$1 to \$4 the, \$1 to \$4 is put into the "Hole In One Insurance Fund". Also the Closest to the Pin monies are divided evenly by the number of holes and flights. If there is a remainder or occasionally no one will get on a green the monies that were designated for this hole and any remainders go into the "Hole In One Insurance Fund".

Award for a Hole In One: \$150.00

Golf Ball prizes are kept for 2 to 3 months. This is to encourage people to come back out. Cash prizes from Skins or Closest to the Pin are good until I see you and you pick it up.

The Point System is quite simple. All participants of a tournament are ordered in order of net finish lowest to highest. Once ordered, the lowest or first person is awarded 150 points. Each subsequent participant is awarded 5 points less than the previous until 50 points is reached. All remaining participants from there are awarded 50 points.

Teams are also awarded points. Points are awarded to teams first to fifth. Each member of the first place team receives 25 points. Each member of the second team is awarded 20 points until the fifth team where each member is awarded 5 points.

Team 1 –	25 pts
Team 2 –	20 pts
Team 3 –	15 pts
Team 4 –	10 pts
Team 5 –	5 pts

TPGC Cup Participants are each awarded 100 points for first and 50 points for second.

Points are compiled September 1 through August 31. The award for the first 5 highest annual point winners is golf credit with the club for the upcoming year in the following denominations:

1.	\$100.00
2.	\$80.00
3.	\$60.00
4.	\$40.00
5.	\$20.00

The Top Point Leader also receives a plaque.

Club Championship – As has been said in other documents, you need to participate in 6 club rounds from September 1 through August 31 to compete **for** the Club Championship. All club members may play **in** the Championship Event and participate in the following dinner but only those with 6 rounds in the preceding year are eligible to play **for** the Club Championship. The difference in the wording **“IN”** and **“FOR”**.

The award for the top 5 Club Championship Finishers is golf credit with the club for the upcoming year in the following denominations:

1.	\$100.00
2.	\$80.00
3.	\$60.00
4.	\$40.00
5.	\$20.00

Also the Club Champion gets his or her Club and NCGA dues paid for the next year and receives a plaque.

All other Club Championship participants participate in the Club Dinner following the last Championship round and participate in the “Club Prize Raffle”.

Playing in the Club Championship or TPGC Cup counts for 2 rounds towards the 6 required for the year that started at the beginning of September.

The overall goal is to encourage participation.
